THERE IS NO ONE CORRECT CHURCH MODEL

- ➤ It is not a sin if we don't train our children to sit in service.
- > Sunday school/Children's Discipleship classes do good work.

- There are good reasons to train children to sit in service.
- ➤ COVID-19 might not have left us with many choices in this season.

- ➤ Will it be worth the embarrassment, trouble and pain?

Types of "services" in the Bible

- ➤ Passover = Watchnight, Easter, Christmas
- ➤ Rejoicing = Special services (Anniversary)
- ➤ Confession, solemn assemblies = Sunday services
- ➤ Baptisms

How is faith passed on to children?

Deuteronomy 4

⁹...Make them known to your children and your children's children— ¹⁰how on the day that you stood before the Lord your God at Horeb...

Deuteronomy 6

4"Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. ⁵You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. ⁶And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. ⁷You shall teach them diligently (impress them) to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise.

How is faith passed on to children?

- > By them being present
- > By them asking questions
- ➤ By parents telling and explaining to them the meaning of these things

If our children are not present at our worship services, how do we "impress" upon them what God is doing in our lives?

TRUTH

Makes sense right?

RATIONAL TRUTH

If you start bringing your child, from 3 years old onwards, to every Sunday service, how many times would he/she have experienced worship service by the age of 13 or 18?

- > 468 times by age 13
- > 780 times by age 18

They'll get there "eventually"

- ➤ Too difficult?



TRUTH: LOOK AT OUR YOUTHS

- ➤ Youths are disengaged/not interested/are not able to adjust well to main worship service/need something else.
- ➤ What happened? Why did we stop following these biblical examples?
- ➤ Age-segregated classes
 - ➤ Cultural shift in education
 - ➤ Cultural shift in efficiency
 - ➤ Leaving it to the "experts"
- > Parents abdicate their responsibility to the church
- ➤ The church allowed it



Churches will begin "[to] build buildings to support segregation and they will do it with excellence. They will not build for racial segregation, but to support age segregation. Both the natural appeal of such buildings and the programming centered there will guarantee [that] teenagers will only experience church life with people almost precisely their own age. Adults will find no ways to bless children, much less even see them. Young people will be cut off from the richness of almost all adult relationships. And, most importantly, they will not see members of their own families until it is time to meet at their cars to go home."

TRUTH: A NECESSARY SEASON?



BEFORE - Preparation begins during the week

- ➤ Read the Scripture passage for the coming Sunday create familiarity
- ➤ Look out for special items during the next service create anticipation

BEFORE - Just before service

- > Prepare pen and notebook
- Trip to the toilet
- ➤ For older kids, set expectations



DURING - Goals for training

- ➤ That children learn early and as well as they can to worship God heartily.
- That parents be able to worship.
- ➤ That families cause [as little] distraction to the people around them.



DURING - Expectations

- > Sit or stand or close eyes when the service calls for it.
- ➤ Sit up straight and still not lounging or fidgeting or crawling around, but respectful toward God and the worshipers around you.
- ➤ Keep bulletin papers and Bible and hymnal pages as quiet as possible.
- > Stay awake. Taking notes helps.
- ➤ Look toward the worship leaders in the front. No people-gazing or clock-watching.
- ➤ If you can read fast enough, sing along. At least keep your eyes on the words and try to think them. If you can't read yet, listen very hard.





AFTER - if child did well

- ➤ Readily praise the child
- ➤ Mention one or two things he could improve on

AFTER - if (older) child disregarded established expectations

- ➤ Immediately find a private corner and deliver deserved words
- Carry out consequences as promised



TEACH: SUMMARY

➤ Training begins at home

- ➤ Create familiarity and anticipation
- Doing family devotions helps this

(Faith at Home: Family Devotions - Look out for it next year!)

- ➤ Use obvious helps
 - > Elements of service
 - ➤ Other people
- ➤ Encouraging your child after



Before planting The Town Church in Fort Collins, Colorado, we attended a church in North Dakota that offered childcare up to (not through) age 2. At the time, we had a 1-year-old son, and I was pregnant with our second child. As the months ticked closer to Ezra's second birthday, I had a sense of dread well up in me, wondering how I could parent a 2-year-old through a service while tending to a newborn.

While my husband, Vince, was somewhat available to help, Sunday was a work day for him, and I was often solo-parenting. As I looked
